-DC VA Med Center Update and US Vets Status_June 11, 2020

As of June 8th, 125 of the 365 positive cases at the DC VA Med Center are DC veterans or staff members, 15 are being treated as inpatient. 12 of the 27 deaths are DC veterans.

MOVA VetsRide Update_DC VA Med Center Transportation:

- 545 rides completed in March-May 2020 by MOVA's VetsRide program to/from the DC VA Med Center.

Elective Procedures / ReOpening CBOC & CRRC:

Following a downward trend of positive cases per day, and inpatient care numbers, DC VA Med Center is working on a plan to begin elective heart surgeries and other pressing procedures by July 6th, 2020. This is subject to change. SE CBOC and CRRC reopening plan is in the works, PPE and staff requirements are the main driving factors.

DC VA Med Center Staff Testing:

On May 28th, the Federal Dept of VA stated to Congress that there was adequate testing for all staff members at VA Hospitals. On June 8th, this claim was refuted by the VA's Health Admin Director, Dr. Stone while he was testifying to the Senate Veteran Affairs Committee. Only 12% of VA health staff are being tested on a regular basis. This is a very concerning discrepancy. At the DC VA Medical Center, 640 or the roughly 2,000 staff have been tested, or only 32%. That is higher than the national average but still dangerous to our DC veterans and DC staff members. MOVA will be closely tracking this statistic. US Vets:

DC veteran transitional home US Vets (152 Wayne Pl SE - Ward 8) had four veterans test positive for COVID-19 over the last 24 hours. There are currently 50 DC veterans living in the facility and 14 staff. The DC VA Medical Center provides grant dollars to this facility. The DC VA Medical Center will conduct testing on all residents and staff this week and then one week later. DC Dept of Health to assist with Contact Tracing.

[In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, eligible DC veterans will receive (10) private ride vouchers, per month, for transport to health and housing appointments, food distribution sites, grocery stores, pharmacies, education, and employment.]
